NIXLE – Receive Up-To-Date Information Affecting Marysville by E-Mail & Text Messages In order to better serve our citizens, the City of Marysville has implemented Nixle, a real-time messaging system that will allow you to receive timely alerts, advisories and community information by email and/or text message. How to Sign Up for CodeRED Union County and the City of Marysville officials have established an emergency notification system in our community called CodeRED. CodeRED is used to place outbound phone calls to home, business and cell numbers. It's an easy way to quickly call everyone within our community (or a specific geographically mapped portion of our community) for evacuation notices, search and rescues, boil alerts, man-made or environmental disasters, utility notifications, etc. To sign up your phone number for CodeRED, click on 'Resident Information' in the left-hand column of this website's home page, select CodeRED Services and click on the CodeRED box on the right. Addition to the Message Boards The portable City Message Boards have been outfitted with radar detecting units to enable them to be used to inform motorists of their traveling speed in the City. The Message Boards will determine and post vehicles' traveling speed on the boards in a large, easy to read font. The Police Department, in coordination with the Street Department, will schedule the Message Radar Boards to be placed in strategic locations in residential neighborhoods and on major thoroughfares within the City.

Construction Updates

Water Main Replacement on Hickory Drive City crews started the water main replacement construction project on Hickory Drive the week of November 28th with work beginning between Van Kirk Drive and Collins Road. This work will continue through the winter to complete the new 12-inch ductile iron water main installation that ends at Kenny Lane. During the installation, water service may be interrupted for short periods of time. Every attempt will be made to schedule any service disruptions. Traffic will be maintained during the construction work and access to all streets and driveways will be available. Police and Court Facility The building pad for the main building is complete. Construction crews are working on the footings and columns layouts. They have begun excavation for the PAQC building foundation. Also, the sanitary sewer and detention pond work has begun.

Fire Station Construction crews are moving dirt and the building pad is underway. They are currently working to get power to the work trailer.

Eljer Park Improvements This winter and early spring, City Building & Grounds and Street Division crews will construct two new sand volleyball courts for spring/summer play and tournaments for the 2012 season. Eljer Park was originally planned to have volleyball courts located just west of the tennis courts and basketball courts along the South Walnut Street side so the installation of the two courts will mirror that original plan and intent. Eljer Park is a natural park area to house sand volleyball courts as it has ample parking, restrooms and is located centrally in the City.

Turkey Hill Gas Station/Food Mart Update The private contractor has installed the concrete curb and gravel roadway base along the widened portion of Mill Road. Due to weather delays, the asphalt component of this project will be completed in the spring.
