## Yard Waste, Grass, Brush, and Leaf Collection Guidelines

### General Rules

Please have all yard waste and brush out by **6 a.m.**, curbside, on your regular garbage day. Do not set yard waste in alleys.

- The City will **no longer accept dirt or sod**; please call Cherokee Landfill for disposal—1-800-686-1732.
- Residents are required to separate yard waste from other refuse, garbage and recyclable materials.
- Yard waste must be in single biodegradable paper bags with no bags inside. Plastic bags cannot be used. Weight limit of 50 lbs. per bag. Containers as well as garbage cans with yard waste are no longer accepted.
- Yard waste materials include: grass clippings, weeds, leaves, straw, corn stalks, plants, mulch, hedge trimmings, vines, and roots. **NO SOD, DIRT, ROCKS, OR CONCRETE.**
- Please do not put dog, cat or any other animal waste with yard waste; it can go in the regular trash.

## Refuse, Recycling, Yard Waste, Brush, Grass, and Leaf Collection



### Questions and/or Concerns:

#### **For utility billing and payments—**

Call the utility office at **(937) 642-6861** between the hours of 8 a.m.—4:30 p.m., Monday—Friday except holidays.

#### **For trash collection service and yard waste collection (including leaf, grass, brush and yard waste)-**

Call the public service center at **(937) 642-0116** between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday—Friday except holidays.

The City of Marysville encourages residents not to bag grass clippings. Through a regular yard care routine, grass clippings can be left on the lawn, allowing them to work their way back into the soil.

### Brush Collection

- Brush will **not** be collected from Oct 1 through Dec. 31, so that we can provide leaf collection services.
- Brush also must be curbside by **6 a.m.** on your regular trash day. Do not set brush in alleys.
- Brush must be free from nails, rocks, & wire. Mixed bags of garbage, vines, and wire will not be picked up by either trash or yard waste crews.
- Brush includes tree branches, shrub clippings, & vines. **Do not mix vines with any other clippings.** Trees and bushes with roots cannot go through the chipper. Roots must be cut off and will be picked up by other crews.
- No railroad ties, landscaping timbers, lumber, boards, sod, dirt, concrete, rocks, or other debris.
- Railroad ties and treated landscaping timbers can no longer be picked up by the regular garbage trucks or by city crews. Please call Cherokee Landfill for information about landscaping timber disposal at 1-800-686-1732.
- The longer the trimmings are, the easier it is for the City crews to remove them, therefore there is no maximum length. However, trimmings should be at least 4' in length. Smaller than this should be bundled. The maximum diameter is 8". If small brush is bundled, use string or tape, **NO WIRE.**
- The amount of trimmings picked up will be limited to one truck load per day per resident billing address. **Trimmings done by contractors will not be picked up.**
- Live Christmas trees are collected on your regular trash day when placed at the curb by 6 a.m. All decorations and bulbs must be removed before they are placed at the curb. Trees should not be wrapped or placed in bags.

### Curbside Leaf Collection

This service allows residents to rake or blow their leaves to the edge of the roadway/curb.

Leaf vacuums will operate from the first week in October through December 31 (weather permitting).

All leaves must be in paper biodegradable bags from Jan. 1 — Sept. 30.

Please note: leaves must be bagged in the mobile home parks year round. Leaf vacs do NOT run routes in any mobile home park. There is a central location for drop off of leaves and yard waste. Check with the manager of your mobile home park for details.

Rake leaves to the edge of the roadway/curb by Monday morning by 6 a.m. to ensure pickup each week.

Please do not place leaves into the street and keep away from storm drainage inlets. Leaves clog storm sewers.

Please do not pile them around parked cars, fire hydrants; the vacuum equipment is unable to maneuver around parked cars.

All parked cars must be away from pickup areas.

Keep children away from leaf piles that are ready for collection.

Leaf piles mixed with grass trimmings, stones, branches, dirt, etc. will not be collected.

After this service has ended for the year, place leaves in paper biodegradable bags for collection as a part of the yard waste program.

## Refuse and Recycling Collection

Effective January 1, 2009, the City of Marysville will enact a flat rate, unlimited collection program for refuse, recycling, and bulk item collection and disposal.

Please have all trash and recycling to the curb by 6:00 a.m. on your trash day.

### Program Costs:

Charges will be \$21/month for all residents.

\*Seniors (65 years and over) will be able to apply for a discounted rate of \$15/month.

Note: Toter rental is additional \$3.00 per month.

\*Seniors wanting the discounted rate will be responsible for making application on a form available from the utility office (Plum St. side of City Hall) at (937) 642-6861 or on-line at our website at [www.marysvilleohio.org](http://www.marysvilleohio.org). Proof of age and residency at the property for which the discount is being applied. Other items may be requested as necessary to confirm that the seniors receiving the discount rate are the persons directly benefitting from this rate reduction.

### Program Benefits:

Unlimited curbside bag collection \*\*

Unlimited curbside recycling \*\*

Unlimited curbside bulk item collection \*\*

\*\* For those items the City can collect.

The City cannot collect household hazardous waste items (batteries, paint, cleaning supplies, motor oil, or other chemicals), tires, or any appliances containing Freon.

The North Central Ohio Solid Waste District has a Hazardous Waste Disposal day in the spring to dispose of paint, batteries, motor oils and other household hazardous waste.

Tires, batteries, motor oil, and appliances containing Freon should be disposed of by contacting Union Recyclers directly at (937) 642-7283. Fees may apply.

### Holidays

**Refuse-** If your regular trash is on or after the following holidays and the holiday is on a week-day, pickup will be delayed by one day.

These holidays are: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July Fourth, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

### Yard Waste, Brush, & Leaf Collection-

If your regular yard waste day is on or after the following holidays and the holiday is on a week-day, service will be delayed.

These holidays include: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, President's Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, July Fourth, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, Friday after Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day.

The week after the holiday, collection will resume on its normal scheduled day for all refuse and yard waste services.

### Sharps and Needle Disposal

If you or someone in your household uses sharps, care should be taken to avoid injury to any household members or sanitary workers in their disposal. There are two options for disposal of these items.

### Collection Program at Memorial Hospital of Union Co.

Used needle disposal is available at the Outpatient Laboratory for the community. Used needles must be placed in a rigid container with a tight fitting lid and taken to the Outpatient Lab. on Monday—Friday between the hours of 6 a.m. and 9 p.m. Check with the hospital lab for any questions and/or concerns. The lab phone number is (937-578-2411).

### Trash Disposal

Placing sharps in the solid waste system has one major disadvantage- it places people at risk of being stuck by a needle and increases their chances of contracting a blood borne infection. **Even sharps that are in a**

container run the risk of injuring someone if that container is damaged, which usually happens during the waste process, allowing sharps to break free of the container.

To dispose of household sharps in your trash, make sure to use a **standard needle disposal container that can be obtained from your local pharmacy. No other container will be accepted. Set this container beside your trash container and the refuse worker will take care of disposal. Please do not put in trash container.**

### Recycling

Recycling bins are provided at no charge to city residents. Please have your recycling bin out at 6 a.m. and leave out until 7 p.m. on day of pickup.

Please note the following guidelines in preparing items for recycling. Recyclables improperly prepared or mixed with trash will not be picked up. Only the items listed can be collected curbside. If you miss a curbside collection day, you may save for pickup the next week.

#### ALL METAL FOOD & BEVERAGE CANS

- Rinse CLEAN and drain completely.
- Cans may be flattened to save space.
- Labels may be left on.

PAPER—Newspaper with ad slicks, magazines, cereal boxes, telephone books, mail, office paper, kraft paper (brown paper grocery)

- Stack loose or place in a paper bag(s).
- Newspaper inserts are OK.
- Corrugated Cardboard boxes (no larger than 2' x2' - must fit in or on top of bin)
- DO NOT set out paper on wet, rainy/snowy days. Wet paper CANNOT be recycled. Save for sunny days.

PLASTIC BOTTLES—SOFT DRINK, MILK & WATER JUGS, DETERGENT, SOFTENER & BLEACH

- Only plastic bottles with the # 1 or # 2 symbol found on the bottom.
- Rinse CLEAN.
- NO PLASTIC BAGS, STYROFOAM, DELI CONTAINERS, TOYS, MOTOR OIL CONTAINERS, BUCKETS, LIDS, BUTTER TUBS, PLASTICS #3-#7 OR PLANT TRAYS.
- You may flatten plastics to save space.

#### GLASS FOOD JARS & BOTTLES

- Remove caps & lids
- Rinse CLEAN.

- Paper labels do not have to be removed.
- NO MIRRORS, CERAMICS, LIGHT BULBS, WINDOW GLASS, PYREX HEAT RESISTANT GLASS, CHINA OR DISHES
- ONLY clear, green and brown glass

#### MISCELLANEOUS INFO:

- All recycling will be picked up between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. on your normal trash day. If your normal day is a holiday, Your pickup will be the next day.
- **The holidays observed by the recycling crew are New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.**
