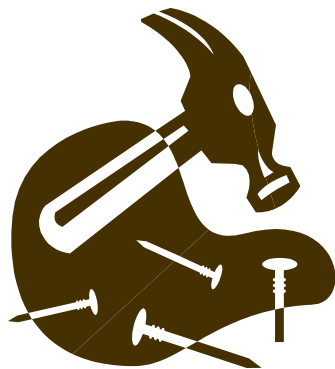


# Parks & Recreation Summer Newsletter 2006



## New at the Pool

**Shelter Rentals**

Shelters throughout the City of Marysville Park System can be reserved for special occasions.

The resident fee is \$25 for up to 4 hours and \$40 for the entire day.

The non-resident fee is \$40 for up to 4 hours and \$55 for the entire day.

The Sean Doebert Memorial Amphitheater along with the Paris Township Pavilion can also be reserved. The resident fee is \$50 per hour and non-resident fee is \$70 per hour.

A \$100 security deposit is required at the time of reservation. The deposit is returned after the scheduled event is over, provided no damage or excessive clean up is needed.

**2006 Summer Playground Program**

The Summer Playground program will continue to be Monday through Friday the entire summer beginning Monday, June 12th and ending Friday, August 4th.

This year's Playground Program will be held in two locations, Eljer Park and Mill Valley Park-Central. Mill Valley will be supervised from 9:00 a.m. to noon and Eljer Park will be supervised from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Both parks have public restrooms and drinking water for the children's convenience.

The City of Marysville Parks & Recreation Department's Playground Program is a traditional program designed for neighborhood children to participate in organized activities with their friends. The Playground Program is open for children in grades 1 thru 6. This is not a baby sitting service. The children will be free to come and go as they please. The playground program is free but there will be a small charge for crafts. A playground program sign has been installed at each park designating that the program is either open or closed. Parents, if you drop off your child, make sure that the program is open. In cases of bad weather, the program may close early or not open at all.

### Special Notes

The Pool will be closing on June 14th, and June 21st at 4:30 pm for home swim meets.

On July 15, the pool will not open until 4 pm due to the Swim Invitational.

During swim lessons the pool will close at 7:30 pm.

### Season Pass Sales

Use the registration form on page 8 or download it from the web site, [www.marysvilleohio.org](http://www.marysvilleohio.org) to purchase your 2006 Pool Pass. This form is **only** for pool memberships and no other activities. This form may be mailed (with check or money order) or turned in at the Public Service Center (8:00 a.m- 4:30 p.m.) located at 455 North Maple Street. Proof of residency is required for all pass purchases. A current utility bill is a great form of proof. **After May 27th, passes will only be available at the pool during regular hours.** Before May 27th, the passes can be picked up at the Public Service Center during regular hours or by providing a self-addressed stamped envelope.

### Swim Lesson Sign-Ups to be held at the Municipal Pool beginning May 27th thru June 14th

Swim lesson sign-ups will be held at the Municipal Pool on May 27th and will end June 14th. Registration for swim lessons will be during normal business hours.

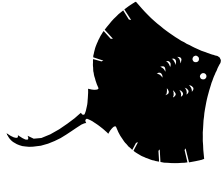
There will be only 1 swim lesson session: Monday through Friday on **June 19, 20, 22, 23 and on June 26, 27, 28, 29 & 30th. There will be no lessons on Wednesday, June 21st because of a home swim meet.**

Swim lesson times in the morning session will begin at 9:30 am and in the evenings beginning at 7:30 pm. During swim lessons, the pool will close to the public at 7:30 p.m.

American Red Cross Water Safety Instructors will teach the classes and will be aided by an American Red Cross Lifeguard. Each lesson will be 30 minutes in length.

**Classes will be limited to 10 children in each class and there will be no exceptions. We are required by the Red Cross to have a minimum of 8 - 30 minute classes.**

*Please Note: Once you have registered for lessons, there will be no refunds unless a medical excuse is provided by a physician with a diagnosis of the reason for not being able to participate in the lesson session. Cold weather or an uncooperative child are not valid reasons for a refund.*



## Join the Stingrays Swim Team!

The **City of Marysville Parks & Recreation Department** sponsors a summer recreational swim team for children up to 18 years of age named “**The Stingrays**”. Participation is open to both resident & non-resident youngsters. This program is designed to be a fun learning experience for swimmers of all ability levels and includes daily practices with competitive meets during the season. The only requirements for participation are the ability to swim 25 meters and the completion of all paperwork with accompanying fees paid prior to beginning practice. Practices will be held at the Municipal Swimming Pool in the American Legion Park. (If the weather has not warmed up the pool as the season begins, practice will be held in the mornings at the Union County YMCA. This will be announced at sign ups.) Meets are normally held on Wednesday evenings &/or Saturday mornings both at our home pool as well as at several pools in the greater Columbus area.

Summer swim team will have sign-ups during normal pool hours beginning May 27, 2006. More detailed information regarding the swim team will be available to families at that time. The first practice will be June 5th.

Practices are on **Monday, Tuesday, and Friday Evenings** from 5-6:30 pm for 11 and up & 6:30 pm -7:45 pm for 10 and under and in the **mornings on Wednesday & Thursday** from 9 -10:30 am for 11 and up & 10:30 –11:45 am for 10 and under.

**All paperwork must be turned in and fees must be paid prior to beginning practice.**

**The Municipal Pool will have limited hours of operation on Tuesday, May 30th to Friday, June 2 and from Tuesday, August 22 through Friday, August 25, and August 28 to September 1st. The pool will open at 4:00pm and close at 8:00pm.**

## LEARN TO SCUBA DIVE



Again this year at the Municipal Pool, scuba classes will be offered.

**Monday—Thursday, July 17, 18, 19 and 20**

**The Underwater Connection, a PADI certified facility, will instruct the scuba classes. The date for lessons are July 17, 18, 19, & 20 from 6 pm to 9 pm.**

**The scuba certification requires four class modules and open water check-out dives. The open water dives are not included in the class registration and are arranged through the dive shop.**

**The cost for the program is \$239.00 and includes all the needed equipment, except a towel.**

## **Pool Admission Regulations**

1. All persons entering the pool must pay a daily entry fee or show a valid season pass.
2. Upon payment of the daily entry fee, the purchaser agrees to abide by Admission Regulations and the Pool Rules.
3. **All Patrons must sign in as requested by the Union County Health Department.**
4. Season/Family passes and daily admissions are not transferable and may only be used by the person whose name appears on the pass. Passes will be revoked if there is misuse.
5. Season/Family passes include parents and their children under the age of 18. Children 18 through 23 are included on season passes if they are a full-time student. Proof of college status is to be provided by the parents.
6. When a family pass is purchased, proof of residency is required. A Utility bill is a great example of proof of residency.
7. Family passes **do not include** grandparents, nannies, baby sitters, cousins, nieces, nephews, grandchildren, or out of town guests.
8. A **Resident** lives inside of the City of Marysville corporation limit. If you only work inside the City, you **do not** qualify for the resident fees.
9. Nurses and/or Medical Caregivers are permitted to be placed on a family pass if documentation is provided with the medical condition.
10. Admission to the pool must be made through the main entrance. Anyone caught falsifying identification or in any way gaining illegal entry, may be prosecuted.
11. Suspension of pool privileges by City personnel does not entitle the person to a refund of fees paid for admission and/or a season pass.
12. At anytime, proof of identification may be requested to verify the name on the season pass.
13. The City of Marysville is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
14. Use of the Municipal Pool is strictly voluntary, the City is not liable for any accidents.
15. Loitering at the entrance or fences outside the pool area will not be permitted.
16. Persons under the influence or suspected to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs shall be denied entry into the pool.
17. All children 11 and under must be accompanied by a responsible person who remains in attendance. The responsible person must be in close proximity within the pool gates to those children who are non-swimmers. Parents will be requested to pick up unaccompanied children.
18. After any morning activity at the pool, all participants must exit the pool and enter under the normal admission procedures. No saving of lounges, etc.

**The City of Marysville Parks and Recreation Department  
reserves the right to change or amend the rules or regulations at anytime.**

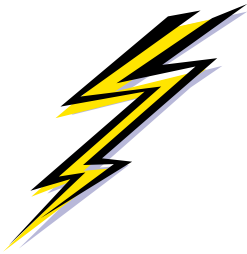
## Pool Rules

1. To provide a safe and enjoyable pool facility, unruly or dangerous behavior will not be tolerated.
2. Running, chicken fights, dunking, towel snapping, horseplay, pushing, throwing of litter, or any other activity deemed dangerous or inappropriate by the lifeguards or management will not be tolerated.
3. There shall be no kissing or any other inappropriate contact at the City of Marysville Municipal pool. Violations of this rule shall be at the discretion of the pool staff. Violator shall be removed from the facility.
4. Alcohol, drugs, **smoking**, cutoff shorts, loud or abusive language, food or drink in the immediate pool area are prohibited. **There is no smoking at the pool facility, this includes the pool entrance and steps.**
5. There shall be **no glass containers** brought into the Municipal Pool.
6. The destruction of property shall not be tolerated.
7. Persons having open sores, communicable diseases, wounds, severe sunburns, or bandages will be prohibited from the pool.
8. To provide for safe use of the diving facility, only 1 person at a time on the diving board or tower. Divers must go straight off the end of the board and are permitted only one bounce.
9. Only forward dives are permitted, **no flips at anytime.**
8. Divers must exit the pool at the closest ladder or swim straight out and under the rope to exit the diving area.
9. The next diver may not approach until the previous diver has reached the rope or ladder.
10. There will be no diving or jumping from the pool deck as water depths are not suitable for diving, with the exceptions of the swim lesson activities or swim team activities.
11. After 6:00 pm a lap lane will be established, **if there is no swim practice being conducted.** Only persons swimming laps will be permitted in these lanes. The swimming pattern should be on the right side of the lane as you swim down and back, as multiple swimmers are possible.
12. Only bathing suits are to be worn on the pool deck and in the water. Please remember this is a public pool and all bathing suits should be appropriate. The city reserves the right to deem what is appropriate and persons wearing inappropriate suits will be asked to leave.
13. Infants must have on a "**swim diaper**"; Swim diapers may be available for purchase at the office.
14. No tee shirts or tank tops are permitted in the pool unless there is a religious or medical exception (with proof provided).
15. The only street clothes permitted will be the adult/adults supervising a child/children in the pool.
16. The use of rafts, tubes, and flotation devices are permitted. Any crowded or unsafe conditions may result in the usage of the raft, tube, or flotation device being denied by lifeguard or management.
17. No one talking to the lifeguards while they are on duty in the lifeguard chair, unless it is an emergency.
18. To demonstrate adequate swimming ability in the deep end or to use the diving boards, children may be asked to take a swim test. The swim test will consist of swimming the length of the pool in the deep area..
19. Pets are not allowed in the Municipal Pool, unless the animal is a guide dog as permitted by law.

**The Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to amend these rules for the safety of the general public at anytime.**

**The last 15 minutes of each hour will be a safety break. This is an adult swim only time. Minors will be prohibited from being in or around the pool except those infants of "holding age" being held by parents.**





## Municipal Pool Weather Guidelines

When lightning or thunder is seen or heard, the pool will be cleared for 20 minutes. After each reoccurrence of thunder or lightning, the 20 minutes will begin over.

When thunderstorms are persistent, the manager on duty will close the pool area.

If persistent thunderstorms close the pool...

1. During swim lessons (9:00am- 11:30 am), a manager will re-evaluate the weather at noon.
2. During open swim 12:00-3:30, a manager will re-evaluate the weather at 4:00 pm.
3. During open swim after 4:00 pm, a manager will re-evaluate the weather at 6:00 pm
4. During open swim after 6:00 pm, the pool will be closed for the evening.

If the air temperature drops below 70 degrees and the skies are overcast and/or raining, the pool will be open for information and membership sales only from Noon-2:00 pm. The weather will be re-evaluated again, then, if no change, we will follow the persistent thunderstorm guidelines.

The pool may close for other emergency situations, if they occur.

Safety will be the # 1 concern, when thunder and lightning is in the area.

**If the weather is questionable,**  
**call the pool at 642-1046, to find out what the status is.**

### **Notice**

**Fecal contamination can be dangerous. If an accident occurs, please contact the closest life-guard so the proper procedures can be put into action.**

### **Pool Rental**

The Municipal Pool can be rented for groups or parties by contacting the Parks and Recreation Department office at 642-0116.

The resident cost is \$135.00 for up to 50 people plus \$35.00 for each additional fifty people.

The non-resident cost is \$190.00 for up to 50 people plus \$35.00 for each additional fifty people.

The last day of rental will be August 12th.

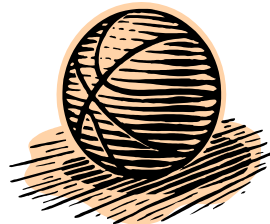

**Playground Safety  
Guidelines**

The play equipment throughout the City park system is heavily used. When used properly, they give kids and their families hours of quality playtime and physical activity. In an effort to keep everyone safe, we are including the following guidelines for your child's safety.

**Caution**

- Playing on the equipment with bare feet may cause injury
- Throwing mulch or any other object within the play area may cause injury.
- Playing on equipment when it is wet may cause injury.
- No pushing, running, or shoving

If you notice broken or damaged equipment, contact the Parks & Recreation Department at 642-0116.

**City of Marysville  
Park Rules and Regulations**

**Did you know?**

- No large domestic or non-domestic pets or animals are permitted in a City Park with the exception of cats and dogs, without the permission of the Director of Public Service and/or Superintendent of Parks and Recreation and/or their designee. A violation of this provision constitutes a minor misdemeanor.
- All pets must be controlled by a leash. A violation of this provision constitutes a minor misdemeanor.
- Pet owners must clean up after their pets. A violation of this provision constitutes a minor misdemeanor.


